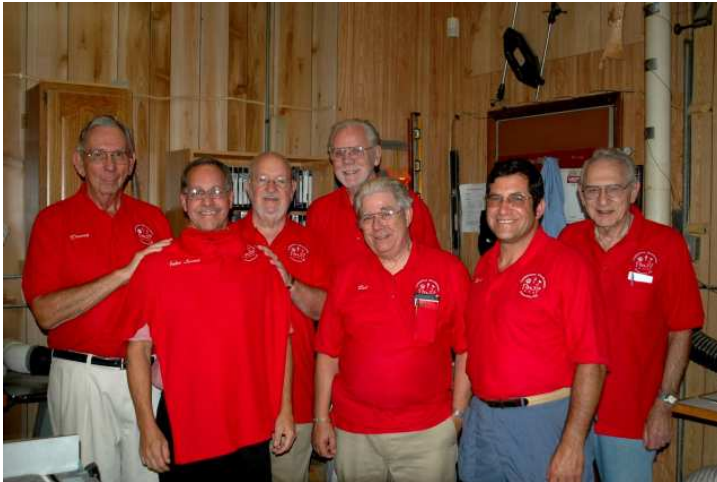

**Tip of the Month**

**Sawdust/The Turner's Friend**

Mixing sawdust with glue has been used for ages to patch and fill-in Small voids. Collecting the dust to do this is not hard to do in our dusty shops, but the dust you get is often dirty, or it is a mixture of dust from many types of wood. To get just what you want, do this. Clean the surface of your dust collector hose intake and tape a piece of paper towel to it. Using fine grit sandpaper turn the same type of wood needed. Stop when enough sawdust has collected in the towel.
