1. Meeting was called to order at 6:00pm with 44 members present.
 - a. Two new members were welcomed; Mike Eckert and Shauna Braun
2. Motion was passed to accept the minutes in the January Newsletter.
3. Motion was passed to accept the Treasurer's report sent to members via an email in advance of the meeting. Club balance is \$4769. Charity balance is \$0.

Old Business:

1. Mike Anderson Demo will be Thursday, May 29th and all-day Saturday, May 31. A motion was passed to set the Cost at \$25.00 for each Saturday participant to help offset \$600 cost. We will ask for an account of Saturday attendance at the April meeting so we can invite other clubs to participate.
2. Knoxville club to have a demo with Nick Cook on May 3rd at Woodcraft Knoxville. Cost is free. May 4th is a workshop for 10 people. Cost is \$65.00 each. Contact Gordon Sloane if interested.

New Business:

1. The 2025 Cumberland Woodturners Board's proposed budget was accepted.
 - a. Motion was passed to award a TCAT student a \$200 academic scholarship.
 - b. Motion was passed to have the club award a \$500 scholarship to a woodturning school. The club will hold a raffle to raise money for Room and Board for interested members. Members winning the scholarship must demonstrate what they learned at a future meeting. Gary Gilpatrick and Ted Pelfrey formed a committee to recommend raffle details and report at the next meeting.
2. Bob Kohle will contact Miniwax on wipe on poly price.
3. Safety talk was given by Ken Warrick on the need for a proper facemask when turning or using power equipment. Reminder: 2 people must be present at TCAT whenever power equipment is operated or a bandsaw blade is changed.
4. Art in the Park at FFG will be 21 and 22 June. A motion was passed to apply and pay the \$100 entry fee. Tom Neckvatal is the coordinator.
5. Bob Kohle spoke with Myra Orton and her prices are \$300 for a 3 hour demo plus room and expenses and \$199 each for a 8 Person Sunday demo plus room and expenses. The club will vote on whether or not to Book her for a future training at the next meeting.
6. Tim Audette has volunteered to help as club photographer for meetings. The new Ornament Coordinator is Tom Neckvatal.
7. The Saturday workshop will remain at TCAT due to changing circumstances.
8. Dogwood Exchange is no longer participating with retail sales for the club. Family Boutique and Market Place has agreed to host a tree and ornament sale for free They will charge club members a 15% commission to sell members work.
9. Woodcraft Knoxville will have training on Bandsaw tuneup on March 15th; cost is free.
10. Demonstrators are needed for June, Sept, Oct, Nov. and Refreshments Aug, Nov.

The AAW Safety Booklet is posted on our website, along with other safety tips.

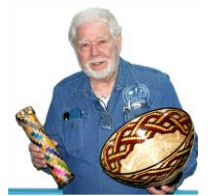
