Safety Note




















BRUCE BRACKETT TURNING CHRISTMAS TREE TOPPER

Bruce did a fine demonstration on the turning of a Christmas Tree Topper. Starting with the center globe with a diameter of approximately 3 inches. The finial was next and should be about twice the diameter of the globe, Finally, the base should be about 2 inches long, 1 inch goes inside the globe and 1 inch below, This length is necessary to support the topper on the tree. Bruce uses the gray Scotch Brite for finishing. Very well done, Bruce. The Challenge for January is a tree topper.
