GORDON SLOANE EAR RING STAND DEMO

Gordon performed a demo turning an Ear Ring Stand based on an article in the AAW, American Woodturner magazine February 2019, Vol. 34, No.1 by Kip Christensen. He outlined the steps he takes beginning with placing a recess tenon on the base of the piece after rounding up the blank. He went on to use a special hole drilling jig that he had gotten from the author of the article which fits directly on the piece for drilling the holes. He then demonstrated different tool techniques he uses to achieve the desired look and form of the piece. Good job Gordon









